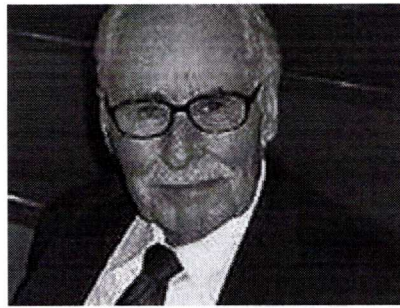

Reverend Ed Ballew

Reverend Ed Ballew, 86, a resident of the Sugar Creek Community in Bradley County, went home to be with the Lord Thursday evening, November 18, 2010 surrounded by his family and friends. He was the son of the late Andrew and Viney Ballew. He is preceded in death by his wife Pauline Patterson Ballew and his brother, Windell Ballew. He was a renowned evangelist worldwide and preached for 64 years seeing many lost souls saved. He pastored a number of churches in Tennessee, Georgia and Florida. He also had several radio broadcast for many years. He and his wife were the founders of the Rock of Ages Prison Ministry. He received a Doctor of Divinity Degree from Faith Baptist Bible College & Messianic School of Theology. He was a member of Calvary Baptist Church in Red Bank and an honorary member of the Way of the Cross Baptist Church in Cleveland.
