## Information on Evangelist Maze Jackson Class 2

Birth- Nov.23, 1922-----Death- May 16, 1996 Died at 73 years of age Buried at Decatur in Dekalb County Georgia



One of the greatest old-fashioned evangelists to ever come on the scene is Maze Cleveland Jackson Jr. He was an American Independent Baptist evangelist, best known as *Brother Maze* to fellow preachers and friends. Jackson hosted *The Truck Driver's Special*, a long-running radio series popular among truckers and their families, as well as "believers from border to border and coast to coast". He was also the editor of *The Preacher's Goldmine*, a sermon and Bible study magazine for ministers. A series of digests from this magazine was called *Golden Nuggets*.

He was born and raised in Hendersonville, North Carolina, Jackson made his home in Atlanta, Georgia. His wife, known as "Sister Dot," worked with him in his ministry. Dot was responsible for having Brother Jackson to collect sermon outlines from preachers and she put them together in the *Preacher's Gold Mine*.

God bless Maze and Dot with three sons from the Lord. The oldest son is Lowell, the middle age son is Nolan and the youngest son is Dale. Nolan is a pastor in the state of George and also does Christian counseling.

Brother Maze pastored two churches before going into full time evangelism. The churches where he was pastor were Jackson Creek Baptist Church in Columbia, South Carolina. In addition, he was pastor of the Calvary Baptist Church in Greer, South Carolina.

In his latter years he was one of the best loved radio preachers of his day. His radio broadcast was aired all across America. It came on a daily schedule, especially in the southern states.

God touched many lives through the consistent, Spirit-filled ministry of Maze Jackson. He traveled up and down the highways of our nation preaching the Gospel. He is now in eternity with his Lord.

He loved attention getting catchy sermon titles and was a natural sermon builder. Many preachers have been helped and blessed through the ministry of Brother Maze. He moderated many camp meetings in the eastern part of the United States. Maze Jackson was a Preacher's Preacher.
