The Virgin Birth Incarnation of Jesus Christ

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Text: II John 1:7 For many deceivers are entered into the world, who confess not that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh. This is a deceiver and an antichrist.

Introduction: The Bible declares that Jesus was a much God as if He had never been man, and as much man as if He had never been God. This is known as the hypostatic union. There is no earthly analogy that can be used to illustrate this supernatural birth and union.

In the one person, Jesus Christ, there are two natures; a human nature and a divine nature, each in its completeness and integrity, and these two natures are organically and indissolubly united, yet so that no third nature is formed thereby (A. H. Strong Systematic Theology, p. 673).

He always says, I, me, mine. He is always addressed as thou, thee, thine. He is always spoken of as He, His, Him. I. Some False Views of the Incarnation. A. Ebionites. They denied the reality of Jesus'______ nature. The Ebionites embraced an adoptionist Christology, thus understanding Jesus of Nazareth as a mere man who, by virtue of his righteousness in following the Law of Moses, was chosen by God to be the messianic "prophet like Moses" They rejected the Virgin Birth of Jesus, instead holding that he was the natural son of Joseph and Mary. The Ebionites believed Jesus became the Messiah because he obeyed the Jewish Law. B. Gnostics. They denied the reality of Jesus' nature. The Gnostics, believed that you couldn't just say you were a follower of Jesus and expect to go to heaven after death. Instead, you had to purify yourself until you achieved gnosis: experiential ____ of the divine reality.

Arius taught that Jesus Christ was divine/holy and was sent to earth for the salvation of mankind but that Jesus Christ was not equal to God the Father in rank and that God the Father and the Son of God were not ______ to the Holy Spirit.

C. Arians. They affirmed Jesus' preexistence but denied His ______.

Nestorians. They believed two persons actually indwelt the body of Christ, the person and the person.
According to Nestorius, Jesus is the union of two persons—a human person and a divine person. This is not a union of essences but rather a close moral union. In other words, Nestorius believed the union was not such that we could say the of Jesus actually belongs to the Son of God.
D. Eutychians.
The Eutychians went to the opposite extreme and said both the natures (the human and divine) mingled to make up a and totally different nature from the original two natures.

Luke 1:17 And he shall go before him in the spirit and power of Elias, to turn the hearts of the fathers to the children, and the disobedient to the wisdom of the just; to make ready a people prepared for the Lord.

Luke 1:76 And thou, child, shalt be called the prophet of the Highest: for thou shalt go before the face of the Lord to prepare his ways;

Matthew 1:20-21 But while he thought on these things, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared unto him in a dream, saying, Joseph, thou son of David, fear not to take unto thee Mary thy wife: for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Ghost. 21 And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name JESUS: for he shall save his people from their sins.

Luke 2:25-26 And, behold, there was a man in Jerusalem, whose name was Simeon; and the same man was just and devout, waiting for the consolation of Israel: and the Holy Ghost was upon him. 26 And it was revealed unto him by the Holy Ghost, that he should not see death, before he had seen the Lord's Christ.

8. To Anna.

Luke 2:36-38 And there was one Anna, a prophetess, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Aser: she was of a great age, and had lived with an husband seven years from her virginity; 37 And she was a widow of about fourscore and four years, which departed not from the temple, but served God with fastings and prayers night and day. 38 And she coming in that instant gave thanks likewise unto the Lord, and spake of him to all them that looked for redemption in Jerusalem.

A. The prophetical reason.
Micah would predict the place some centuries before.
B. The symbolical reason.

C. The historical reason.
Jacob's final son was born here. His mother called him Benoni, meaning, "," while his father named him Benjamin, "son of my right hand." Centuries later Jesus would also be known as a man of sorrows, and the son of His Father's right hand.
