The Early Years & His Humanity

Text: Luke 2:40 And the child grew, and waxed strong in spirit, filled with wisdom: and the grace of God was upon him.

Luke2:52 And Jesus increased in wisdom and stature, and in favour with God and man.

Introduction: The Scriptures gives us very little detail about the years of Christ's life from His birth until the day of His baptism by John the Baptist. The apocryphal Gospels tell much about the Lord's school days and His behavior before His teachers and play-mates; but none of this is recorded by the Four Gospel accounts. The apocryphal accounts present a child who is sullen and uses miracles for entertainment rather than doing the will of God. Where the Bible is ______, we do well not to try to add to the early years of Christ.

I. His Circumcision.

Luke 2:21-24 And when eight days were accomplished for the circumcising of the child, his name was called JESUS, which was so named of the angel before he was conceived in the womb. 22 And when the days of her purification according to the law of Moses were accomplished, they brought him to Jerusalem, to present him to the Lord; 23 (As it is written in the law of the Lord, Every male that openeth the womb shall be called holy to the Lord;) 24 And to offer a sacrifice according to that which is said in the law of the Lord, A pair of turtledoves, or two young pigeons.

Lev 12:1-4 And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying, 2 Speak unto the children of Israel, saying, If a
woman have conceived seed, and born a man child: then she shall be unclean seven days; according to
the days of the separation for her infirmity shall she be unclean. 3 And in the eighth day the flesh of
his foreskin shall be circumcised. 4 And she shall then continue in the blood of her purifying three and

his foreskin shall be circumcised. 4 And she shall then continue in the blood of her purifying three a thirty days; she shall touch no hallowed thing, nor come into the sanctuary, until the days of her purifying be fulfilled.

Lev 12:6-8 And when the days of her purifying are fulfilled, for a son, or for a daughter, she shall bring a lamb of the first year for a burnt offering, and a young pigeon, or a turtledove, for a sin offering, unto the door of the tabernacle of the congregation, unto the priest: 7 Who shall offer it before the LORD, and make an atonement for her; and she shall be cleansed from the issue of her blood. This is the law for her that hath born a male or a female. 8 And if she be not able to bring a lamb, then she shall bring two turtles, or two young pigeons; the one for the burnt offering, and the other for a sin offering: and the priest shall make an atonement for her, and she shall be clean.

II. His Dedication.

Exodus 13:2 Sanctify unto me all the firstborn, whatsoever openeth the womb among the children of Israel, both of man and of beast: it is mine. Numbers 3:13 Because all the firstborn are mine; for on the day that I smote all the firstborn in the land of Egypt I hallowed unto me all the firstborn in Israel, both man and beast: mine shall they be: I am the LORD. Note: Here is some interesting information about God giving Moses' instruction on ______. A baby's blood is saturated with antitoxins or disease-fighting elements which it receives from its mother before birth. For the first week an infant is protected against _____. Also in the blood is a "bloodclotting ability" which increases rapidly the first week and reaches it normal concentration about the beginning of the second week of life. Since the disease-fighting antibodies begin to decrease after the first week, operations after that time are attended with infection. But since the infant's blood-clotting ability does not reach its normal number until the end of the first week, operations before that time are attended with the danger of hemorrhage. Hence the safest time for surgery is at the very point where both the disease-fighting qualities and blood-clotting ability are at their highest point---the day. III. His Visit by the Wise Men. However, there is no real historical evidence to verify this. The Bible reason for their visit would excite Herod and cause the death of many children two years of age and under. Jeremiah 31:15 Thus saith the LORD; A voice was heard in Ramah, lamentation, and bitter weeping; Rahel weeping for her children refused to be comforted for her children, because they were not. Matthew 2:16-18 Then Herod, when he saw that he was mocked of the wise men, was exceeding wroth, and sent forth, and slew all the children that were in Bethlehem, and in all the coasts thereof, from two years old and under, according to the time which he had diligently enquired of the wise men. 17 Then was fulfilled that which was spoken by Jeremy the prophet, saying, 18 In Rama was there a voice heard, lamentation, and weeping, and great mourning, Rachel weeping for her children, and would not be comforted, because they are not. Here Jesus is 12 years of age; in Judaism when a boy becomes of age (puberty) there is a bar mitzvah ritual. Where it is believed that the father is no longer held accountable for his son's sins; but the boy becomes responsible for his own actions.
